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# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 July 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

# **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES Objectives and aims**

The objectives of the Charity are:

- To advance the education of young people, in particular but not exclusively, living in impoverished circumstances
- To act as a resource for young people, providing advice and assistance; and organising programmes of physical, educational and other activities as a means of advancing in life; and helping young people by developing their skills, capacities and capabilities to enable them to participate in society as independent, mature and responsible individuals.
- To further such purposes as are recognisable as exclusively charitable under the law of England and Wales.

# The aims of the Charity are:

- To improve access to good quality education
- To increase retention and attainment
- To create lasting change for disadvantaged young people
- To create opportunities in the workforce for disadvantaged young people
- To equip young people with greater confidence and skills
- To improve the well-being of disadvantaged young people.

# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2018

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### The focus of our work

INTO Giving partners with other charities to provide and improve education for young people around the world living in difficult circumstances. In the period from 1 August 2017 to 31 July 2018 INTO Giving has supported 17 charitable projects in 9 countries across 4 continents.

INTO Giving maintains a special focus on supporting girls' education in the developing world and refugee education. Our projects were:

Nigeria **Bees Abroad** 

INTO Giving, with a £4,560 donation INTO Giving is supporting secondary schoolchildren's environmental education through Bees Abroad at the Multilateral Grammar School in the Odogbolu district in Nigeria. Our support paid for the delivery of beekeeping training, including teacher training, beehive construction materials and personal protection equipment and honey harvesting equipment. 60% of the students learning beekeeping are girls.

Afghanistan **Peter M Goodrich Foundation** 

With an initial donation of £7,500, INTO Giving opened a new school library (the only school library in in Bamyan Province), in partnership with the Peter M Goodrich Foundation. Peter Goodrich died when flight 175 hit the World Trade Center on September 11 2001. His mother started the charity in his name, as a peaceful response to the tragedy. INTO Giving provided the Haider Abad School Library with desks, shelves, furniture, computers, books and the salary and training for a librarian. 44% of the 1,300 students who use the library are girls.

Greece Hope 4 Kids

INTO Giving donated £7,500 to help Syrian, Kurdish and Afghani child refugees who have fled their countries and homes, and now live in or around the Filippiada Refugee Camp in northern Greece. INTO Giving supported six volunteer teachers, who work at the camp for 3-6 months and who delivered a combined 76 teaching and day care hours a week across four sites, and classroom supplies

Zambia I-CCO (In-Community Care for Orphans)

In this financial year we have continued to sponsor orphans and vulnerable children at the I-CCO, many of whose parents have died or are suffering from HIV/Aids. The total for this financial year was £1,680.

Uganda **Alliance for African Assistance** 

Over the past year, INTO Giving provided £7,000 to provide scholarships to fifteen students, and to help run workshops for more than 1,500 students, across twenty-one schools, to help 7-18-year-old schoolchildren advance their schooling towards vocational or post-secondary education.

Cambodia **Trailblazer** 

INTO Giving provided £9,650 toward opening a new primary school for 230 rural schoolchildren (almost half of them girls) and toward purchasing fifty bicycles for secondary schoolchildren who, due to poverty and extraordinary distances between rural villages and schools, have to travel long distances on foot because they can't afford the costs of public transport. Lead teachers track the academic progress and attendance of the students with bicycles to ensure their correct use.

**Bangladesh** Room to Read

INTO Giving is supporting thirty-nine 11-17-year old schoolgirls with a donation of £7,500 (US £9,885). We are providing material support (for example school uniforms, tuition and exam fees) and help pairing girls with strong women in the community who encourage their educational and personal development

**United Kingdom** 

In 2017/18, INTO Giving, as part of its expanded charitable remit to help people through a range of humanitarian and community causes, supported a host of organisations, including:

BBC Children in Need, Brighton Housing Trust, Maggie's Cancer Charity, the East Anglia Children's Hospice, the Stroke Association, Force Cancer Charity, Cancer Research UK and St Giles Trust.

## **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES** The focus of our work

# Raising awareness

INTO Giving is the charitable offshoot of INTO University Partnerships (IUP), which has more than 1,800 employees and, every year, more than 12,000 students from more than 100 countries across the world. The Charity wants to educate these audiences on the power of philanthropy, how it shapes people - particularly young people - as individuals, and how it shapes communities and global society. We raise awareness of our work and opportunities to engage in philanthropy through presentations at universities, IUP publications (in print and online), the charity's website and through Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. This has resulted in hundreds of young people and IUP staff shaping a better idea of philanthropy, its ease and power, and engaging in activities that help some of the most disadvantaged children have access to and stay in education.

# ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### **Fundraising activities**

A total of £236,751 was raised by INTO Giving in the financial year ending 31 July 2018 of which £60,156 was matching funds from Andrew Colin, INTO Giving Founder, and £114,389 was from INTO University Partnerships toward the charity's operating costs.

Events were organised by INTO staff and who gave up their time to plan, set up and run the events, and by INTO students, inside and out of class. All funds raised from these events go direct to the projects and not on INTO Giving operating costs.

INTO Giving appreciates the hard work that has gone into the above fundraising, and would like to thank all those who donated.

## ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Fund-raising activities' financial performance

This year we raised £236,751.

£58,661 has been spent on charitable purposes: £9,650 to Trailblazer (Cambodia); £7,500 to each of the Peter M Goodrich Foundation (Afghanistan), Room to Read Bangladesh, and Hope 4 Kids (Greece); £7,000 to the Alliance for African Assistance (Uganda); £5,000 to St Giles Trust (UK); £4,253 to the East Anglia Children's Hospice (UK); £1,680 to the I-CCO (Zambia); £1,267 to African Adventures (Zambia); and £1,000 to Naru (Guatemala). Grants of under £1,000 were made to each of Maggie's Cancer Charity, Cancer Research UK, BBC Children in Need, Force Cancer Charity, Brighton Housing Trust, the Stroke Association

We have kept our costs to a minimum as follows:

Total costs, therefore, account for 6.5% of total funds raised in the year ending 31 July 2018. Of these costs, £14,929 was paid on behalf of INTO Giving by INTO University Partnerships (IUP) and is shown as a donation in these accounts. This resulted in the charity using only £394 of its own funds toward operating costs in financial year 2017/18.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

## Principal funding sources

The principal funding sources for the Charity come from fundraising activities carried out by INTO University Partnerships (IUP), IUP students and employees, associated partners and other related third parties. These funds are mostly given in the form of individual donations through sponsoring events, standing orders and donations from international students attending IUP courses. Matching funds are provided by INTO Giving Founder, Andrew Colin.

The Charity ensures that all monies raised by the staff of IUP, associated partners, families and friends, the general public, companies and grant-making trusts go direct to our projects. Any costs incurred in the running of the Charity are paid for by INTO University Partnerships and Gift Aid collected on the Founder's matching donations.

#### Reserves policy

INTO Giving maintains reserves to fund suitable projects approved by the board of trustees that are in line with the charity's aims and objectives, and to cover any operating costs not otherwise paid for by INTO University Partnerships. The Charity has, at 31 July 2018, unrestricted reserves amounting to £116,472 as shown on page 9 of these financial statements.

# STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT Governing document

The Charity constitutes a Company limited by guarantee. The Directors are appointed and removed in accordance with the terms set out in the Company's Articles of Association. At least three Directors must be appointed at any one time, but there is no maximum to this number. There are currently four Directors appointed to the Company, all of whom are Trustees of the Charity. A Chairperson is decided at each board meeting in the absences of an appointed Chairperson.

# Trustees

All INTO Giving Trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no benefit from the Charity. The Trustees bring a wide range and relevant range of experience to the Charity including: three who have worked in education either at secondary or tertiary level; two who have served as school Board of Governors; one who has worked overseas in Africa and two with considerable business experience in the UK and abroad.

# STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT Risk management

The Trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to insure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

The main risk to which the Charity is subject to is that of ensuring that funds raised by staff of INTO University Partnerships (IUP), their related companies, families and friends, go direct to the charity and that no funds go astray. This is a particular risk when working with partner charities based abroad.

However, INTO Giving has put in place measures to ensure that, as far as possible, the monies raised are spent on the intended project. This is done by completing due diligence prior to establishing any relationship with partner charities and establishing a close relationships with our partner charities, who provide a clear sets of accounts to INTO Giving showing how our donations have been spent and the impact of these donations on beneficiaries. Partner charities provide regular feedback, and we request they be open to INTO Giving staff and supporters who wish to visit the project.

# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2018

The Trustees review the fundraising activities and the projects they have supported at the end of the year and on a regular basis throughout the year. This review helps us to plan our future projects and fundraising activities and to adjust the plans accordingly. The review also helps us to ensure that we are planning our activities and selecting projects to meet the objectives as set out in the Memorandum of Association.

How our activities deliver public benefit

INTO Giving exists to serve the public, with a special emphasis on ensuring children, young people and others in need benefit from improved access to education and improved quality of education.

Our support for girls' education reduces the risk of girls being excluded from school and further education. To us, girls' education is a case of human and civil rights. Educated girls will marry later, have children later and their children will live longer and are more likely to be educated themselves.

INTO Giving's support for refugees helps ensure that children and young people who have lost their homes and communities continue to learn and, with support from school, rebuild a sense of normality and hope.

We support impoverished children in Nigeria, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Uganda, Greece, Afghanistan through a combination of capital building projects, scholarships, support for classroom and teaching materials, support for teachers, and toward school transport. In Zambia, INTO Giving donations enable orphans and vulnerable children to continue their education. A portion of the monthly sponsorship money for individuals goes towards the teachers' salaries, providing long-term support for the school.

In the UK and the US we support a range of activities, including: homeless services, support for children with life-threatening conditions, stroke and cancer support, and improved confidence and learning enabling young people to stay in school or enrol in vocational training.

## **Future Plans**

INTO Giving will expand its board of trustees in the coming financial year, positioning the charity to function with increased fundraising and communications. We will recruit up to five new trustees in financial year 2018/19.

To meet our commitment to donating larger sums, INTO Giving will, in 2018/19 continue to champion its iGive programme that supports a wide array of humanitarian and community projects, whilst maintaining our commitment to supporting education projects in the developing world and education projects in the United Kingdom and United States.

INTO Giving will in 2018/19 investigate using portions of its restricted reserves to make strategic grants in line with our objectives and with a particular focus on projects supporting education, the environment and homelessness.

INTO Giving will continue to support our existing family of projects if required and where appropriate. All projects put forward will be put to the Trustees for consideration and selection.

#### ACCOUNTING POLICIES 1.

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### **Income**

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

**Expenditure** 

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
